By-Law #2 of the Forestry-Wildlife-Fisheries Alumni Association Constitution was amended on November 5, 2005 to read as follows.

“Prior to July 1, a nominating committee appointed by the President shall submit the names of two or more members for each of the elective offices, the number of names placed in nomination to be left to the discretion of the committee. The committee will make a good faith effort to ensure that the Council is always comprised of representatives from the three major areas of emphasis of the School (1) forestry/forest products, (2) wildlife, and (3) fisheries/aquaculture. The committee will seek names for nominations from the School Director. Alumni, faculty and other sources are encouraged to provide nominations to the President. A call for nominations for officers will be put forth from the Council to the School Director for discipline specific openings based on the current discipline background of the Council. Each name that is submitted to the Council should meet all criteria for running for an office and be confirmed by the School Director or his designee as being interested in running for office. Alumni and others may provide names for consideration for nomination by a petition signed by at least ten members in good standing, provided said petition is received by the Executive Secretary on or before July 15. The names placed in nomination by the above methods shall, by July 25, be submitted by the Executive Secretary to all active members for letter ballot. The polls shall be closed on August 25. The candidate for each office receiving a plurality of votes cast for that office shall be declared elected and shall begin his duties at the conclusion of the next annual meeting. In the event of tie vote in the election of officers by mail, a vote of members in attendance at the next annual meeting shall determine the elected candidate. In the failure to obtain a minimum of two discipline specific names for each discipline specific position on the ballot, the Executive Secretary will then obtain names from any discipline to run for a particular discipline specific position. The Council will be comprised of five voting members (President, Vice President, and three council members). The office of President and Vice President will be elected annually by the Council.”
